WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Laguna Woods, California, on Tuesday, November 5, 2024 ("Election"), in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, California Elections Code Section 10263 requires the City Council to declare elected the persons for whom the highest number of votes were cast for each office; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Election was given in time, form, and manner as provided by law; voting precincts were properly established; election officers were appointed; and, in all respects the Election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received, and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form, and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law cities; and

WHEREAS, the County of Orange Registrar of Voters canvassed the returns of the Election and has certified the results to this City Council, which are attached and made a part hereof as exhibits A and B.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAGUNA WOODS, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The total number of ballots cast in the General Municipal Election held on November 5, 2024 ("Election") was as follows:

Vote Center Ballots Cast:	1,476
Vote-by-Mail Ballots Cast:	11,899
Total Ballots Cast:	13,375

SECTION 2. The names of persons voted for at the Election for Member of

the City Council were as follows:

Eun Ju "Pearl" Lee James Ping-Ya Tung Shari L. Horne Cynthia S. Conners

SECTION 3. The City Council does declare and determine as follows:

- 1. That Eun Ju "Pearl" Lee was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years; and
- 2. That Shari L. Horne was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years; and
- 3. That Cynthia S. Conners was elected as Member of the City Council for the full term of four years.

The number of votes given at each precinct and the number of votes given in the city to each of the persons named in Section 2 for the respective offices for which the persons were candidates are listed in exhibits A and B.

SECTION 4. As required by California Elections Code Section 10264, the City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the results of the Election, showing:

- 1. The whole number of votes cast in the city;
- 2. The names of the persons voted for;
- 3. For what office each person was voted for;
- 4. The number of votes given at each precinct to each person; and
- 5. The number of votes given in the city to each person.

SECTION 5. As required by California Elections Code Section 10265, the City Clerk shall immediately make and deliver to each of the persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the City Clerk and authenticated. The City Clerk, or his/her/their designee, shall also administer to each person elected the oath of office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribe to it and file it in the office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons so elected shall be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected following the administration of the oath of office, and may enter upon the duties of such office upon the filing of the prescribed oath with the City Clerk, as provided under California Government Code Section 36507.

SECTION 6. The Mayor shall sign this resolution and the City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption thereof.

Recommendation

Approve all proposed actions on the December 11, 2024 Consent Calendar by single motion and City Council action.

Background

All items listed on the Consent Calendar are considered routine and will be enacted by one vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the City Council, staff, or the public requests that specific items be removed from the Consent Calendar for separate discussion and consideration of action.

<u>Summary</u>

The December 11, 2024 Consent Calendar contains the following items:

8.1 Adoption of a resolution amending and adopting the Fiscal Years 2023-25 Budget and Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2023-24 commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, and Fiscal Year 2024-25 commencing July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025, unallocating existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations for the "City Hall Complex Parking Lot Improvement Project" and "Ridge Route Drive Drainage Repair Project", and allocating existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to the purchase of electronic message board signs, a speed awareness monitor, and the "Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project." The proposed resolution (Attachment A) would make available for other purposes, \$274,557.60 in American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds) appropriations that are presently allocated to projects that will not be complete prior to the December 31, 2024 deadline to spend or obligate American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds) funds, or are not expected to require the entirety of existing appropriations. The proposed resolution would also allocate \$63,334.38 to the purchase of two electronic message board signs (Attachment B) and one speed awareness monitor (Attachment C), and \$36,649.95 to the Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project.

8.2 [1] Approval of the "Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits)" design plans and specifications as prepared by the project engineer.

AND

[2] Adoption of a resolution amending and adopting the Fiscal Years 2023-25 Budget and Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2023-24 commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, and Fiscal Year 2024-25 commencing July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025, allocating existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to the "Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits."

[3] Approval of a notice of exemption for the "Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits)" finding that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and authorization for the City Manager to cause the notice of exemption to be filed pursuant to applicable law.

[4] Award of a contract agreement to Hardy & Harper, Inc. for the construction of the "Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El

Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits)", in the amount of \$362,000, plus authorized change orders not to exceed 10% (\$36,200) of the base amount; and authorization for the City Manager to execute a contract agreement and approve change orders, subject to approval of the contract agreement as to form by the City Attorney.

- 8.3 Adoption of a resolution adopting and concerning the Measure M2 Expenditure Report for Fiscal Year 2023-24 commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024. The City is required to annually report on Measure M2 net revenues, developer/traffic impact fees, and funds expended to meet Maintenance of Effort requirements. The annual report must be submitted to the Orange County Transportation Authority ("OCTA") within six months of each fiscal year in order for the City to remain eligible to receive Measure M2 funds. The proposed report has been reviewed by OCTA staff.

Purchase of Electronic Message Board Signs and Speed Awareness Monitor

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to allocate existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to the purchase of two electronic message board signs and one speed awareness monitor, as described in exhibits A and B attached hereto, in the amount of \$63,334.38; and

WHEREAS, the "Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project" is included in the Capital Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, appropriations for the Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project were established in an amount estimated as of June 2023, subject to the completion of design documents, construction drawings, and competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, design of the Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project remains underway and staff estimates that additional appropriations in the amount of at least \$36,649.95 will be required to complete design; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to allocate additional existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to the Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project in the amount of \$36,649.95; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient unallocated Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to accommodate the desired allocation; and

WHEREAS, with the proposed Budget adjustment, the total Woods End Wilderness Preserve Trail Drainage and Improvement Project budget would be \$309,209.95 (\$47,012 Capital Projects Fund, \$188,048 State of California Grants Fund (Proposition 68 (Per Capita Program)), and \$74,149.95 Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)).





Background

The Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits) ("project") is included in the Fiscal Years 2023-34 Capital Improvement Program and involves asphalt concrete pavement cold milling and repaving. The work also includes, but is not limited to, traffic control, adjusting utility manholes and water valves to grade, re-establishing survey monuments, painting striping and legends, applying pavement markings, and installing new illuminated street name signs, signal backplates, and visors.

Discussion

Today's meeting is an opportunity for City Council action, as well as public input, on the Pavement Management Plan Project (Westbound El Toro Road between Calle Corta and City Limits).

Staff recommends that the City Council take the following four actions to allow construction to proceed:

Recommendation 1

Approval of the project design plans and specifications as prepared by the project engineer (NV5, Inc.). The design plans and specifications are available for review at or from the City Clerk's Office, Laguna Woods City Hall, 24264 El Toro Road,

Laguna Woods, CA 92637. Telephone: (949) 639-0500. Email: <u>cityhall@cityoflagunawoods.org</u>.

Recommendation 2

Adoption of a resolution amending and adopting the Fiscal Years 2023-25 Budget and Work Plan for Fiscal Year 2023-24 commencing July 1, 2023 and ending June 30, 2024, and Fiscal Year 2024-25 commencing July 1, 2024 and ending June 30, 2025, allocating existing Federal Grants Fund (American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds)) appropriations to the project (Attachment A).

The City's budget includes sufficient American Rescue Plan Act (Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds) appropriations to allocate \$160,942.65 to the project. That amount is intended to cover construction costs.

Recommendation 3

Approval of a notice of exemption for the project (Attachment B) finding that the project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") and authorization for the City Manager to cause the notice of exemption to be filed pursuant to applicable law.

Recommendation 4

Award of a contract agreement to Hardy & Harper, Inc. for the construction of the project, in the amount of \$362,000, plus authorized change orders not to exceed 10% (\$36,200) of the base amount; and authorization for the City Manager to execute a contract agreement and approve change orders, subject to approval of the contract agreement as to form by the City Attorney.

Bids to construct the project were solicited from October 31, 2024 through December 4, 2024. Four bids were received (see Table 1). After review, Hardy & Harper, Inc. is the lowest cost responsive bidder.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAGUNA WOODS, CALIFORNIA, REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 22-65, AND DESIGNATING AND APPOINTING A DIRECTOR TO SERVE ON THE ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS FROM DECEMBER 11, 2024 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2026

WHEREAS, the City, as a "member" of the Orange County Fire Authority Joint Powers Authority, is entitled to appoint a representative director ("Director") to the Orange County Fire Authority Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, each member agency, by resolution of its governing body, must designate and appoint one representative to act as its Director on the Orange County Fire Authority Board of Directors, except the County of Orange whose Board of Supervisors shall appoint two representatives to act as its Directors; and

WHEREAS, each Director shall be a current elected member of the appointing governing body; and

WHEREAS, each Director shall hold office until the selection of a successor by the appointing governing body; and

WHEREAS, each Director is to serve at the pleasure of the appointing governing body and may be removed at any time, with or without cause, at the sole discretion of the appointing governing body; and

WHEREAS, any vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment of a Director; and

WHEREAS, the City Council most recently made its appointment to the Orange County Fire Authority Board of Directors by Resolution No. 22-65.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAGUNA WOODS, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Resolution No. 22-65 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. XX is hereby designated and appointed to serve as the City's

Director on the Orange County Fire Authority Board of Directors from December 11, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

SECTION 3. The Mayor shall sign this resolution and the City Clerk shall attest and certify to the passage and adoption thereof.
